Rationale

- Relevance of G20 as major economies and major emitters
- Need for G20 to lead the way to „make Paris work“
- Long-standing EU diplomacy with all of these countries that can be built on for broad-based multi-level dialogues that lead to climate action → emerging role of climate diplomacy
- Diplomacy and outreach beyond the government: businesses, civil society.....



Basics

- Co-funded project
 - EU: 20 million from Partnership Instrument
 - BMUB: 5 million from International Climate Initiative Funds
 - total amount 25 million
- Project period 1 March 2018 – 28 February 2021
- Target countries = Non-EU G20 – Turkey + Iran



Project objectives

- **Impact:**

Major economies effectively implement the Paris Agreement and NDCs.

- **Outcome:**

Enabling conditions are promoted for major economies to effectively implement the Paris Agreement and their NDCs.

- ***Exchange on policy options & good practices will lead to policy changes*** [15 policy options/good practices changed or newly introduced]
- ***Better bilateral cooperation & more investment for PA implementation*** [5 enabling conditions for private sector investment]
- ***Improved public awareness*** [5 public awareness campaigns]

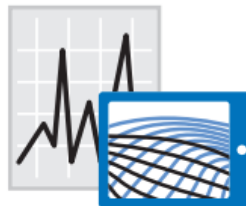
